

Terms and Conditions

- The competition is promoted by Esk & District Kindergarten Ass. Inc. (ABN: 19 937 671 079) Address: 26 South Street, Esk, QLD, 4312. Email: <u>eskkindy@bigpond.com</u> Telephone: 07) 54 241 377 Mobile: 0415555837
- 2. The theme of the art competition is 'Protecting Children is Everybody's Business'.
- 3. The competition will open 8:30am AEST on Tuesday, 11th of August, 2020.
- 4. Entrants must agree with the Terms and Conditions at the time of entry.
- 5. Entry is open to all residents of Queensland, Australia. Entrants aged under 18 years must seek parental/carer permission before submitting their entry.
- 6. Only one entry is permitted per person.
- 7. Entrants must represent and warrant that the work is the entrant's sole original work, the entrant has the power to grant the rights given under it, the entrant is entitled to reproduce and exploit any underlying rights in the work, and the entrant indemnifies the organiser against any loss resulting from breach of these warranties.
- 8. Entrants must provide their full name, contact number and current age, written on a piece of paper or card, attached securely to the back of the entry and NOT visible from the front.
- The entry submitted must be connected to the Queensland Child Protection Week Key Messages (See Appendix 1.) For younger entrants (aged 0 – 11 years) their artwork may illustrate an activity, place or person that helps them feel safe and secure.
- 10. a. A caption/description of at least one sentence but no more than one hundred words should be written on, or attached to, the artwork and visible from the front.
 b. The caption/description must be a Queensland Child Protection Week Key Message and/or an original statement that is related to the Theme/Key Messages.
 c. For younger entrants (aged 0 11 years) the caption/description can be transcribed by the parent/carer assisting them and may relate to the activity, place or person that helps them feel safe and secure.
- 11. Entrants must provide a high resolution digital image of the artwork for online and print reproduction by email to <u>eskkindy@bigpond.com</u> Entrants who do not provide a high resolution digital image of their artwork grant express permission for the organisers to photograph or scan the artwork, to create a digital image to use for online and print reproduction.
- 12. The entrant acknowledges and agrees that the organisers can reproduce the submitted work online and in print for display, competition and promotional purposes.
- 13. There are four categories for entry
 - a. 0 5 years
 - b. 6 11 years
 - c. 12 17 years
 - d. 18 years and over

- 14. There are 18 prizes for the competition: (see Appendix 2.)
 - a. Overall Winner (one prize)
 - b. People's Choice (one prize)
 - c. 'Most Interesting use of Colour' in each category (four prizes)
 - d. 'Most Creative Technique' in each category (four prizes)
 - e. 'Most Powerful Expression of Emotion' in each category (four prizes)
 - f. 'Clearest Message' in each category (four prizes)
- 15. The Esk & District Kindergarten Ass. Inc. will accept the following mediums:
 - a. Painting
 - b. Drawing
 - c. Photograph
 - d. Collage or Combination of Mediums (Must all be original works.)
- 16. All entries must be submitted by 3:00pm AEST on Thursday 3rd of September 2020. Entries can be mailed or delivered to 26 South St, Esk, QLD, 4312. Entries received after this time will not be considered.
- 17. The Esk & District Kindergarten Ass. Inc. reserves the right to remove any entry that does not comply with the Terms and Conditions in any way, or any entry that is deemed offensive, derogatory or racist. As the competition is open to people of all ages and hosted online, the entries must comply with Facebooks community standards and must not depict violence, sexual acts or nudity.
- 18. The Esk & District Kindergarten Ass. Inc. will elect a panel of three external judges who will judge all competition entries. Entries will be judged on the artwork and the maximum 100 word description of how the artwork relates to the theme.
- 19. The panel of judges will determine the 'Most Interesting use of Colour', 'Most Creative Technique', 'Most Powerful Expression of Emotion' and 'Clearest Message' in each category, and also the 'Overall Winner'. The judges' decision is final.
- 20. The Australian Public will vote for 'People's Choice award from Friday the 4th of September. Images of each entry will be uploaded to the Esk & District Kindergarten Facebook Page in albums based on category, along with the artists name. The entry with the highest number of 'likes' at 6:00pm AEST on Sunday the 6th of September will be deemed the winner. In the event of a tie between two artworks in the People's Choice Award, the panel of judges will determine the winner.
- 21. All entries are eligible for the overall prize, however an artwork may only be selected as the winner of a single prize category.
- 22. Artists are asked to provide their age in order to determine the appropriate category for their entry. The purpose of categorising entries by age is to allow a more fair and equal opportunity for them to be considered on their own merits and not against their more experienced peers.
- 23. Winners will be announced online via our Facebook Page on Monday 7th of September 2020 and also contacted directly by telephone.



24. All prize winners agree to the use of their name and artwork for publicity, display and competition purposes without compensation.

- 25. Non-winning entries will be made available for collection from 26 South St, Esk, QLD, 4312 from Tuesday 15th of September. Entrants who wish for their art to be returned by post, should include a reply paid, self-addressed envelope with their entry.
- 26. Non-winning entries not collected from the Kindergarten by 3pm AEST Friday 9th of October will become the property of the organiser.
- 27. Winning entries will be displayed in the Esk Library from Tuesday the 8th of September to the Tuesday the 29th of September.
- 28. Winning entries will be made available for collection from 26 South St, Esk, QLD, 4312 from Thursday the 1st of October. Entrants who wish for their art to be returned by post, should include a reply paid, self-addressed envelope with their entry.
- 29. Winning entries not collected from the Kindergarten by 3pm AEST Thursday the 15th October will become the property of the organiser.

Privacy and publicity

Inc. will collect, manage, use and disclose personal information in accordance with all relevant legislation and standards as per the Privacy Act 1988 (Cth). The Esk & District Kindergarten Ass. By entering, entrants give permission for The Esk & District Kindergarten Ass. Inc. to promote their entry and name on websites, social media and other platforms at the discretion of The Esk & District Kindergarten Ass. Inc.

Appendix 1.

Queensland Child Protection Week Key Messages

- 1. Child protection is everyone's business. The responsibility lies with adults in keeping children safe from harm. All members of society need to play a part in ensuring children are nurtured and safe.
- 2. Adults are essential in ensuring children's safety and well-being.
- 3. Listening to children and young people is the number 1 indicator in assisting their safety and well-being.
- 4. Children and young people are honest. They are unlikely to lie about abuse. They are more likely to stay quiet about abuse or harm than to speak up (especially if they know their abuser).
- 5. Mean or cruel words harm children and young people.
- 6. Understanding why people harm children and young people is essential in helping to prevent child abuse.
- 7. The corruption of children and young people by being forced into acts against their will, including illegal activity harms children and young people.
- 8. Being ignored, going hungry and feeling and/or being treated as invisible harms children and young people.
- 9. Seeing or directly experiencing domestic and family violence harms children and young people.
- 10. Being physically, verbally, sexually or emotionally abused harms children and young people.
- 11. Not having health, educational and other developmental needs met harms children and young people.
- 12. Being groomed for sexual abuse harms children and young people.
- 13. Being forced to do something that feels 'wrong' harms children and young people.
- 14. Being forced into situations that feel unsafe harms children and young people.
- 15. Being forced to be with people (even those who are 'known' and 'loved') who feel unsafe harms children and young people.
- 16. Being forced to be with people who children or young people have stated have abused them, harms children and young people.
- 17. Not being heard when they speak about abuse or trauma harms children and young people.
- 18. Being removed from their home and/or family causes trauma and loss and harms children and young people.
- 19. Knowing they have no voice to speak of how they feel and what they've experienced in terms of their safety and well-being harms children and young people.
- 20. Being without the right to make decisions in their life such as where they live, who they visit and where they spend time harms children and young people.
- 21. Caring for children and keeping them safe is a shared responsibility
